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OVERVIEW

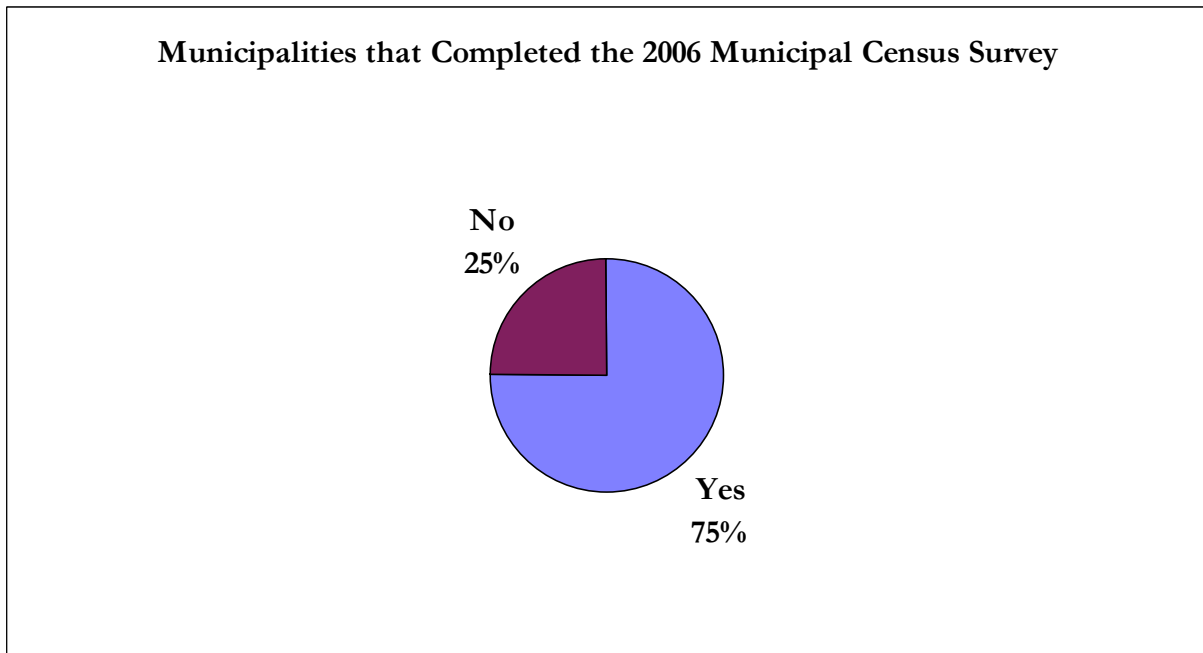
The 2006 General Municipal Information Report is a compilation of results derived from the Municipal Census Survey sent out to member municipalities in the fall of 2005. VLCT conducted its first municipal census in 1995 to provide membership with general municipal information regarding policies and practices. The 2006 Report is the fifth of its kind, and continues a tradition of providing the most current information available regarding how Vermont's local governments work.

Some of the information in this report lends itself to statistical analysis; this information can be found in simple charts and tables. The raw data for all of the general information can be found at the end of this document. The raw data will allow you to create your own comparisons and contrasts.

Seventy-five percent of member municipalities returned their Municipal Census Survey. We appreciate the efforts of these members. We hope you find this information useful as you compare and contrast your municipality with others around the state. Your comments and suggestions regarding the survey and this report are always appreciated.

Remember, the following information does not reflect all Vermont municipalities, only municipalities that responded to the 2006 Municipal Census Survey.

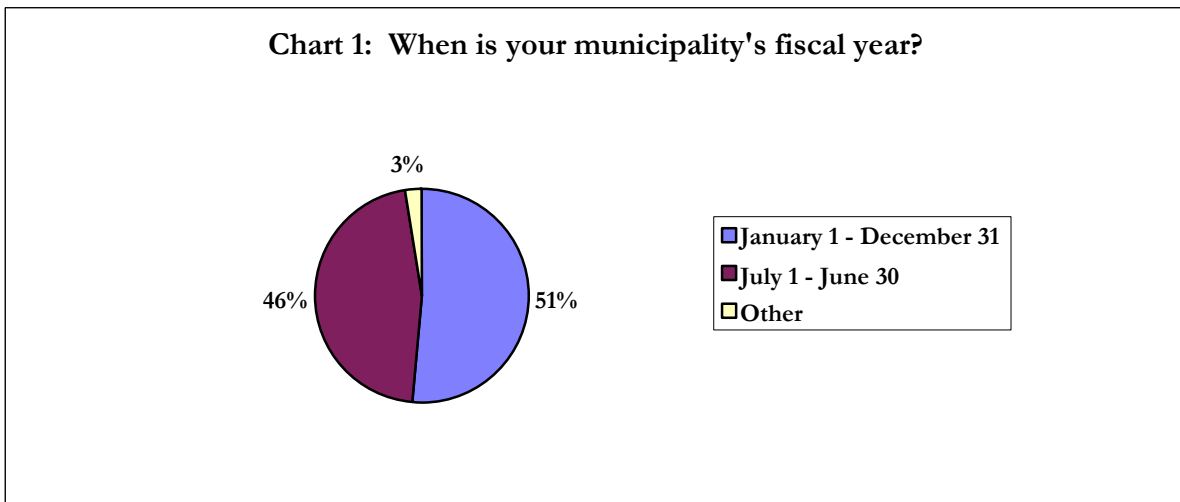

MUNICIPAL OPERATIONS

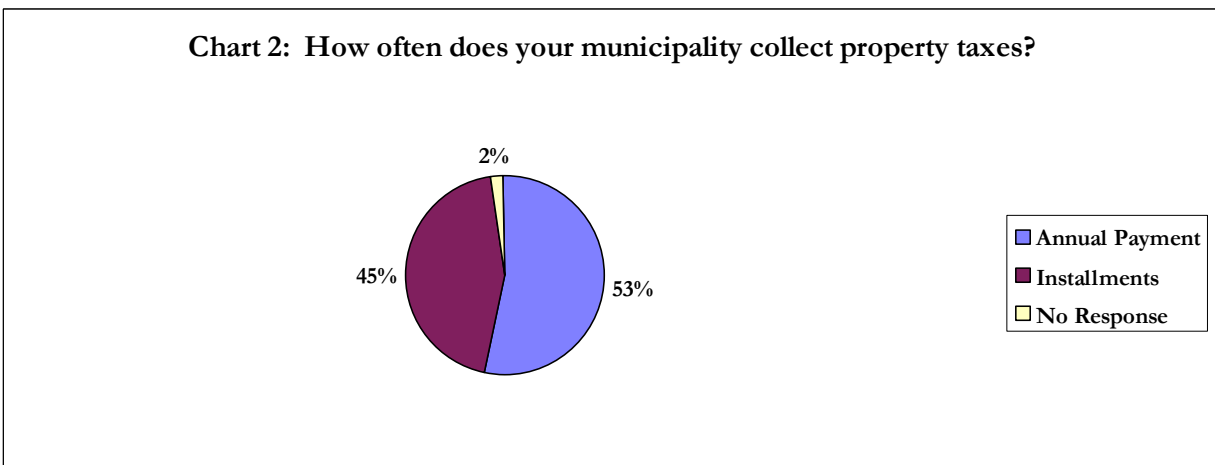
Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of a municipality must run from January 1 to December 31, unless voters approve a different fiscal year at an annual or special meeting. 24 V.S.A. § 1683(c). Chart 1 indicates that 91 municipalities, or 46%, have voted for a July 1 – June 30 fiscal year. Five municipalities, or 3%, have voted for an alternate fiscal year. These include March 1 – February 28(or 29), and April 1 – March 31. The majority of municipalities, 102 or 51%, have not voted otherwise, and continue to operate under the January 1 – December 31 fiscal year, commonly referred to as the “calendar year.”



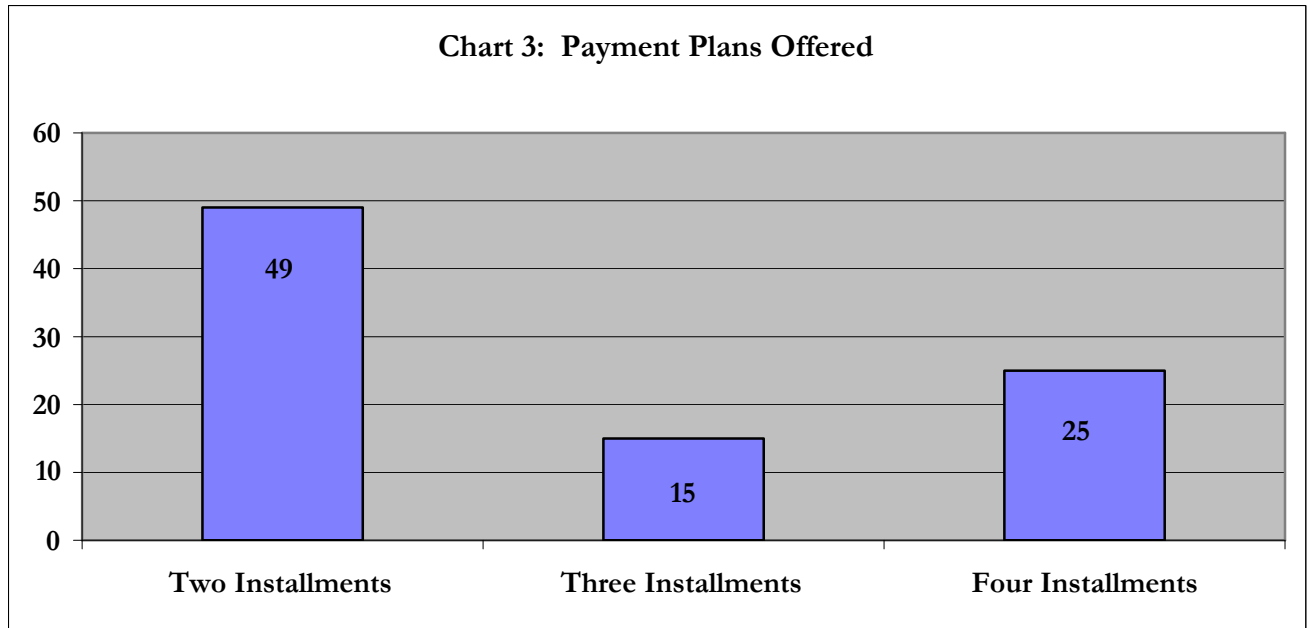
Property Tax Collection

Vermont law gives municipalities the option to vote to collect property taxes in installments. 32 V.S.A. §§ 4871-4873. As Chart 2 indicates below, 105 responding municipalities, or 53%, reported only one annual property tax payment due date. Eighty-nine municipalities, or 45%, offer property tax payment installment plans; 4 municipalities did not respond.



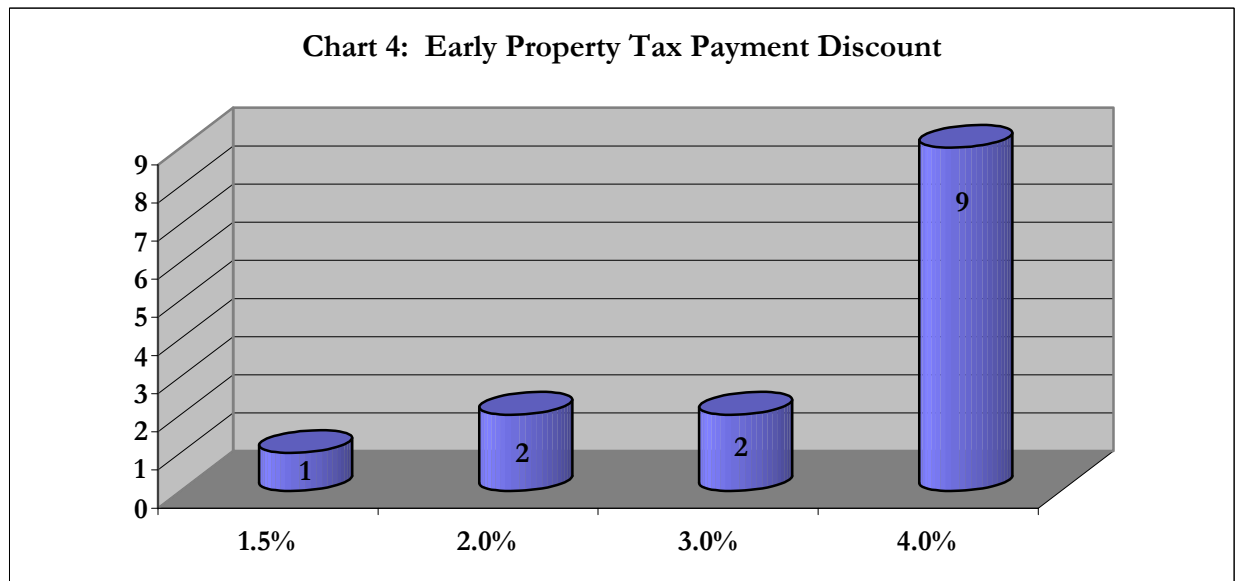
Property Tax Payment Plans

Chart 3 indicates the number of installments offered by the 89 municipalities that offer payment plans. Forty-nine municipalities offer a two-installment plan; 15 municipalities offer a three-installment plan; and, 25 municipalities offer a four-installment plan.



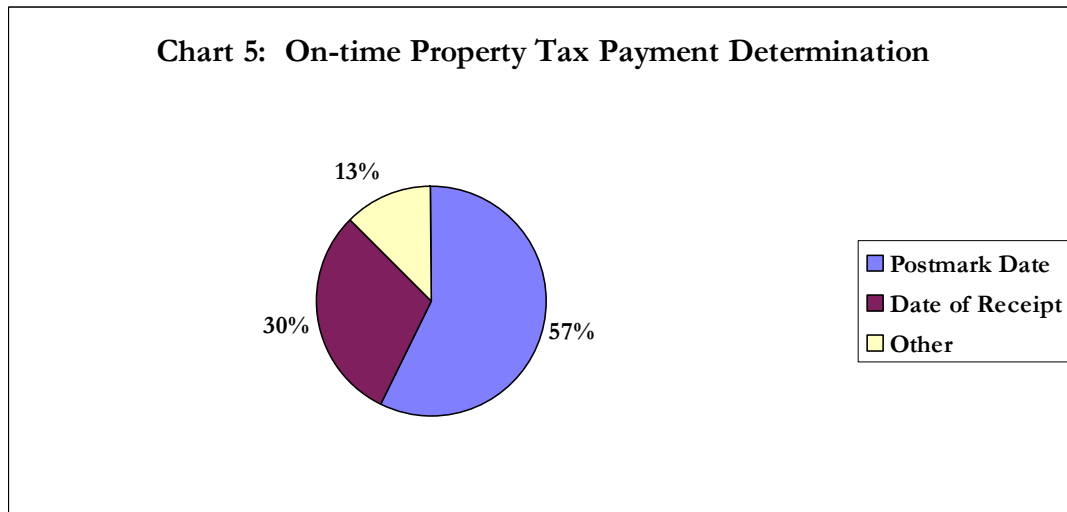
Property Tax Discount

Additionally, Vermont law gives municipalities the option to offer discounted rates to taxpayers who pay their property taxes on or before the payment due date. 32 V.S.A. §§ 4773, 4872. Fourteen responding municipalities noted a percentage discount. Chart 4 indicates the percentages offered in these 14 municipalities.



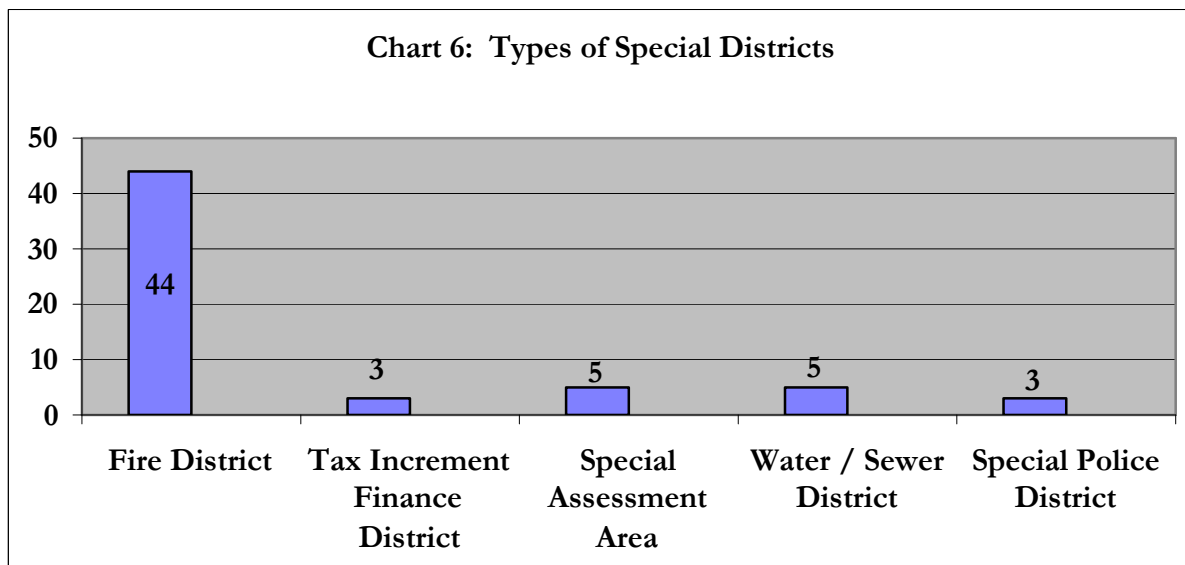
On-time Property Tax Payment

According to 32 V.S.A. § 4773, municipalities have the option to “fix a date or dates, time of acceptance, and method of delivery” for the payment of property taxes. Chart 5 indicates the percentage of municipalities that determine on-time property tax payment by postmark date or receipt date. One hundred and thirteen municipalities, or 57%, determine on-time payments by the postmark date; 60 municipalities must receive the tax payment before it is deemed paid; and 25 municipalities either did not respond or responded that both methods were used.



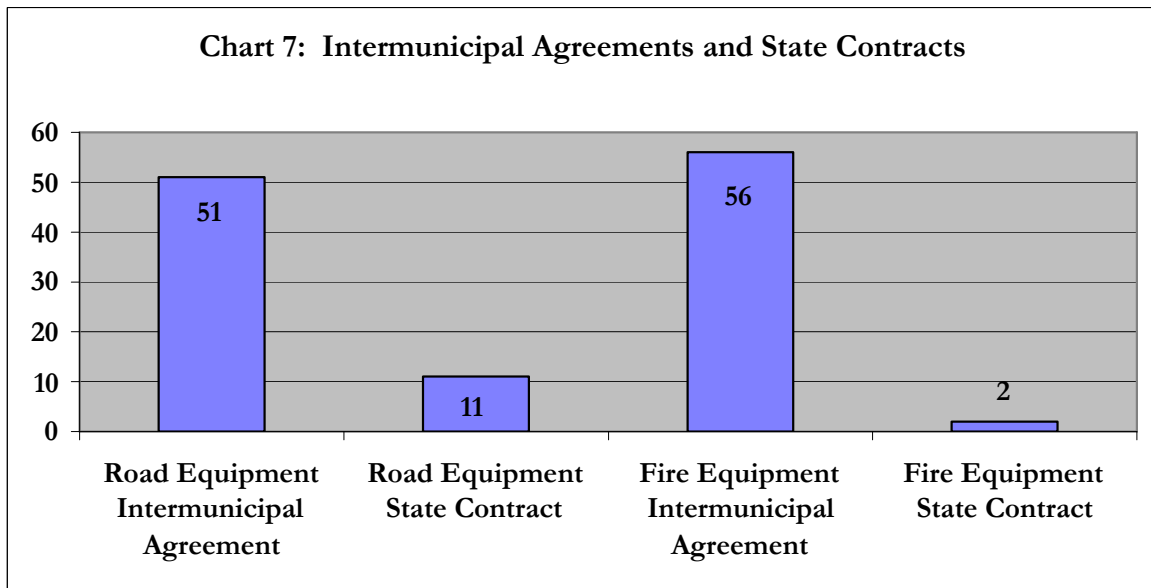
Special Districts

Several sections within the Vermont Statutes grant municipalities the authority to establish special districts, such as fire, special assessment, consolidated water, design control, and tax increment-financing districts. Chart 6 indicates the number of municipalities that have created different types of special districts.



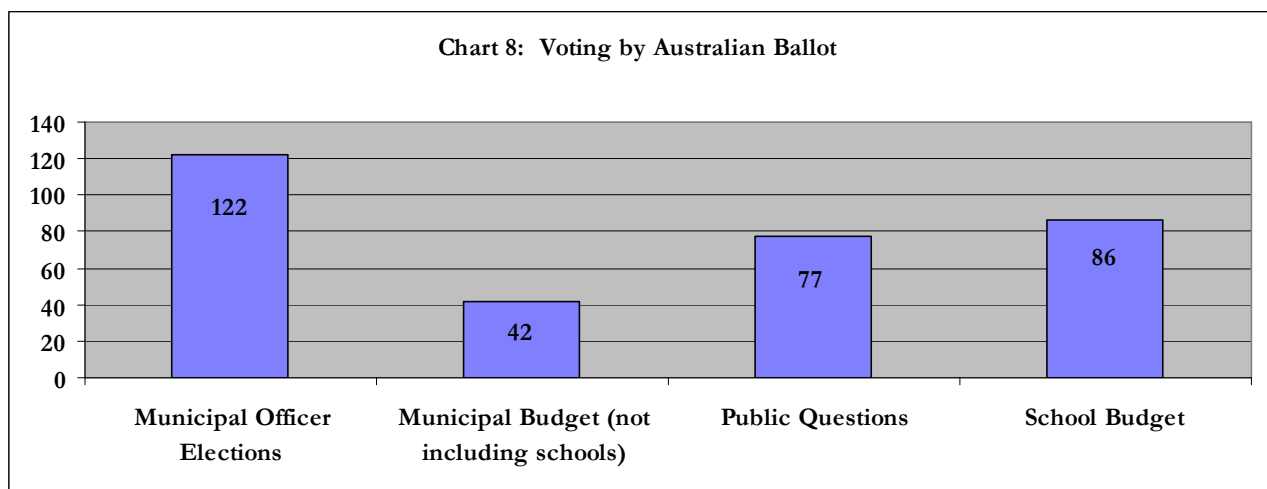
Intermunicipal Agreements and State Contracts

For many municipalities it makes sense to work together. Chart 7 indicates the number of municipalities that have intermunicipal agreements or state contracts dealing with road or fire equipment.



Australian Ballot Voting

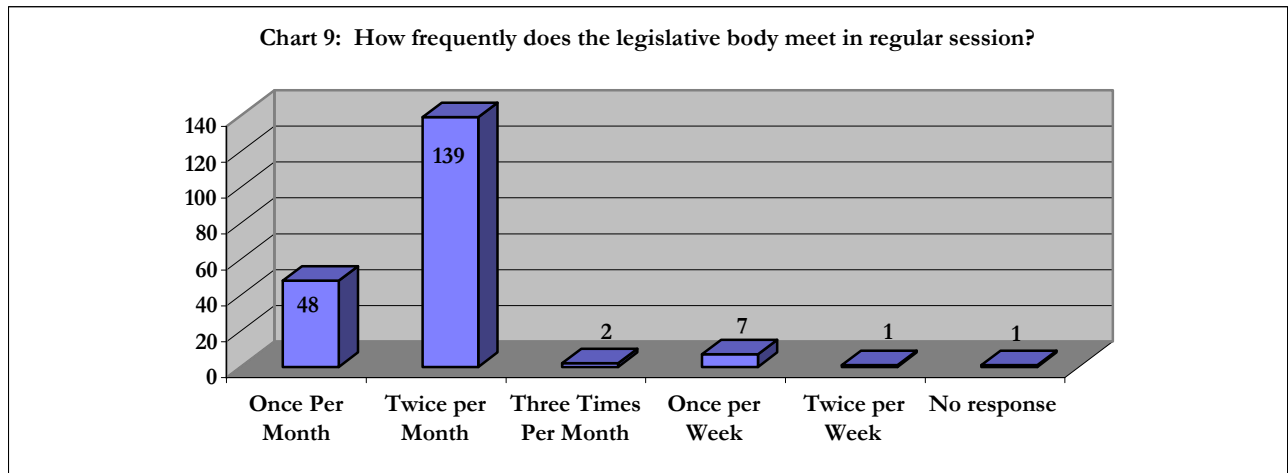
A municipality has the option to adopt the provisions of the Australian ballot system at its annual meeting or a special meeting called for the purpose of voting to apply the Australian ballot system to an election issue. 17 V.S.A. § 2680. For those municipalities that use the Australian ballot system, Chart 8 indicates the topics that voters determine by Australian ballot.



BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

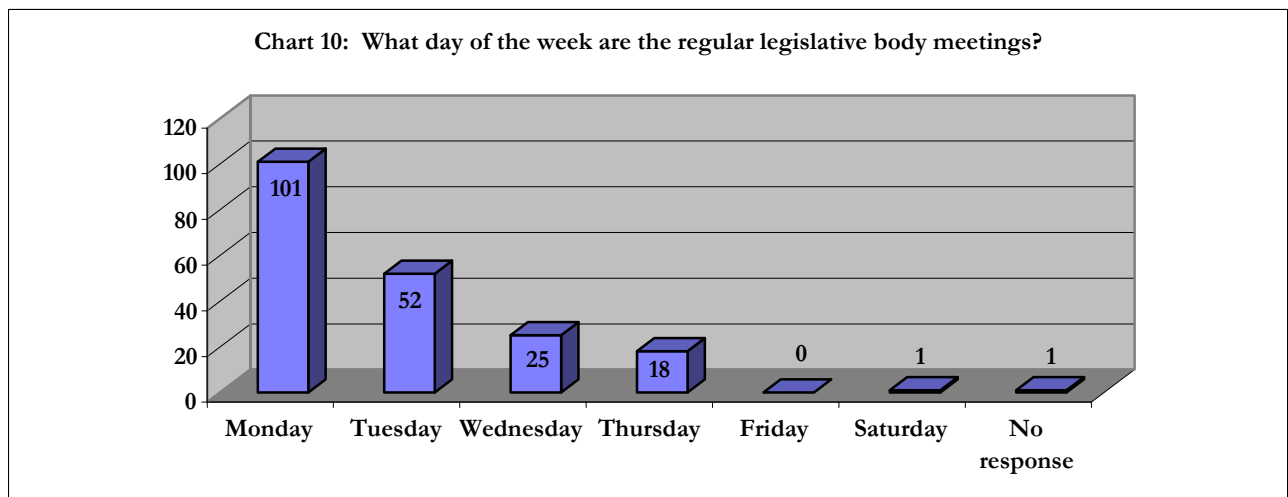
Meeting Frequency

Chart 9 indicates the frequency with which Vermont's legislative bodies meet in regular session. Twice per month is the most popular meeting frequency, with 139 municipalities, or 70%, meeting two times during each month. Forty-eight municipalities, or 24%, meet once per month. Only 7 municipalities, or 4%, meet once per week, while 2 municipalities meet three times per month. Only 1 municipality meets twice weekly and 1 municipality did not reply to the question.



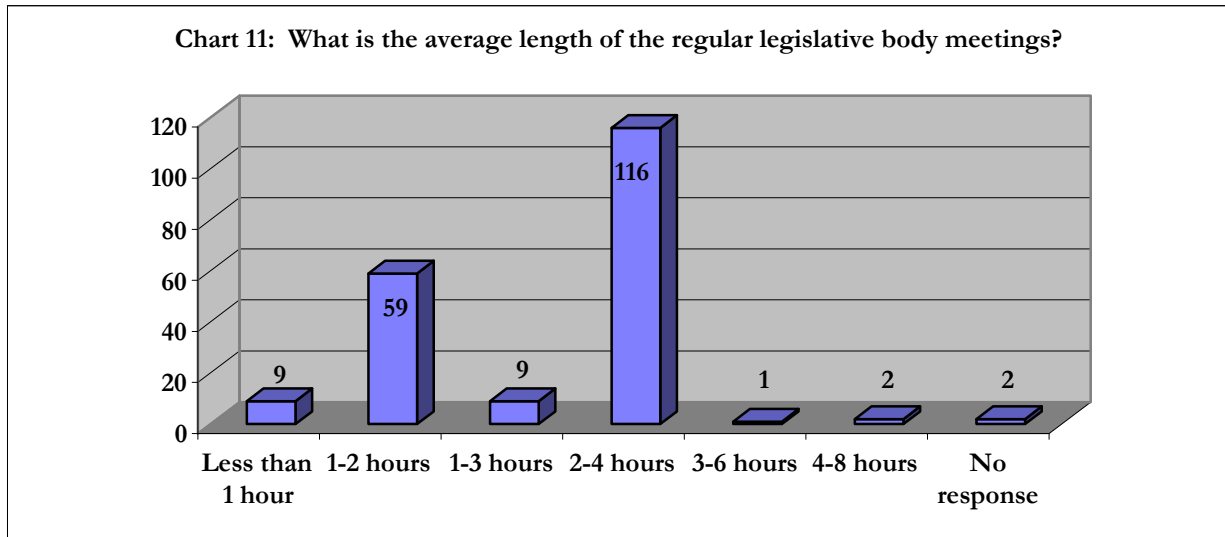
Meeting Day

Chart 10 indicates the day of the week that Vermont's legislative bodies meet in regular session. Monday is the most popular day of the week for holding regular legislative body meetings, with 101 municipalities, or 51%, doing so. Tuesday follows as the second most popular day, followed by Wednesday and Thursday. Fifty-two municipalities, or 26%, choose Tuesday to meet; 25 municipalities, or 13%, choose Wednesday; and 18 municipalities, or 9%, choose Thursday. No municipalities meet on Friday, and only one municipality meets on Saturday.



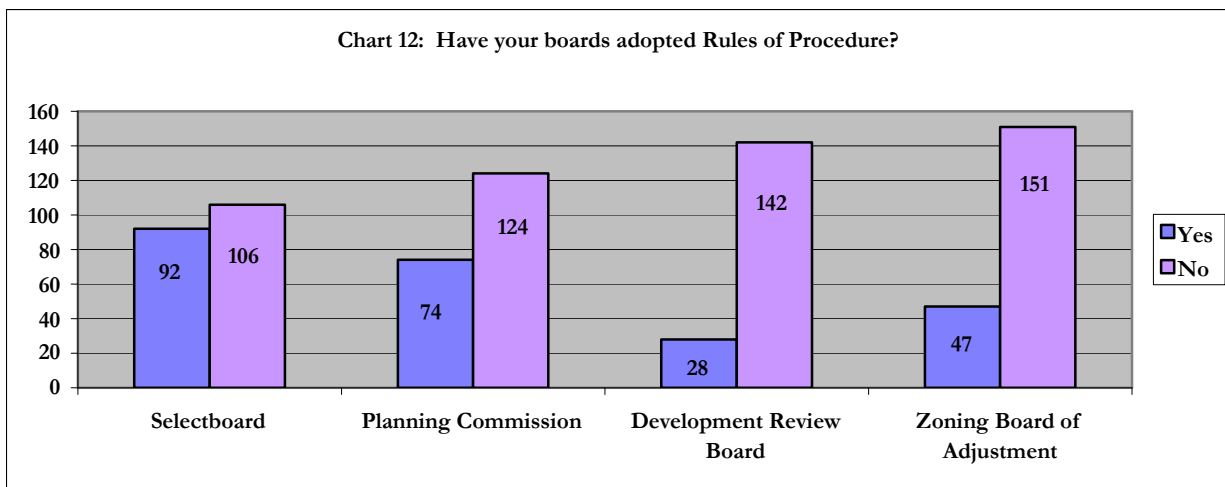
Meeting Length

Chart 11 indicates the average regular session meeting length of Vermont’s legislative bodies. As shown below, 116 municipalities, or 59%, meet for an average of 2-4 hours. Fifty-nine municipalities, or 30%, average a 1-2 hour meeting; 9 municipalities meet for less than 1 hour; another 9 municipalities meet for 1-3 hours; 1 municipality meets for 3-6 hours; 2 municipalities meet for 4-8 hours; and 2 municipalities did not respond to this question.



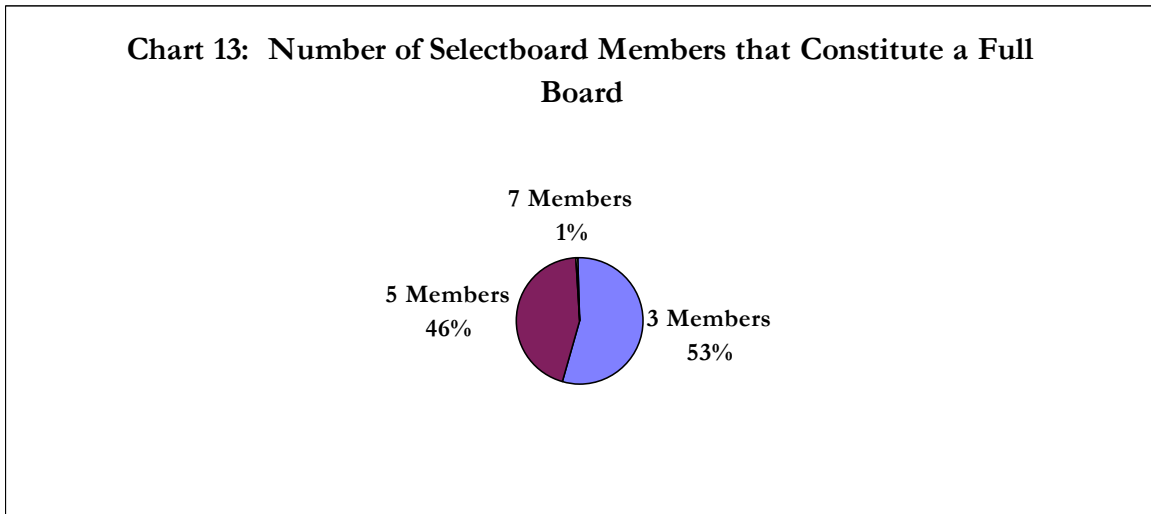
Rules of Procedure

Although most board meetings do not need to be conducted under any specific set of rules of procedures, many boards do adopt rules of procedure in order to avoid logistical problems, confusion, inconsistency, and to provide a solid basis for decision-making. Chart 12 indicates the number of boards and commissions that have adopted rules of procedure with the goal of conducting efficient and effective meetings. The following boards have adopted rules of procedure: 92 selectboards, or 46%; 74 planning commissions, or 37%; 28 development review boards, or 14%; 47 zoning board of adjustments, or 24%.

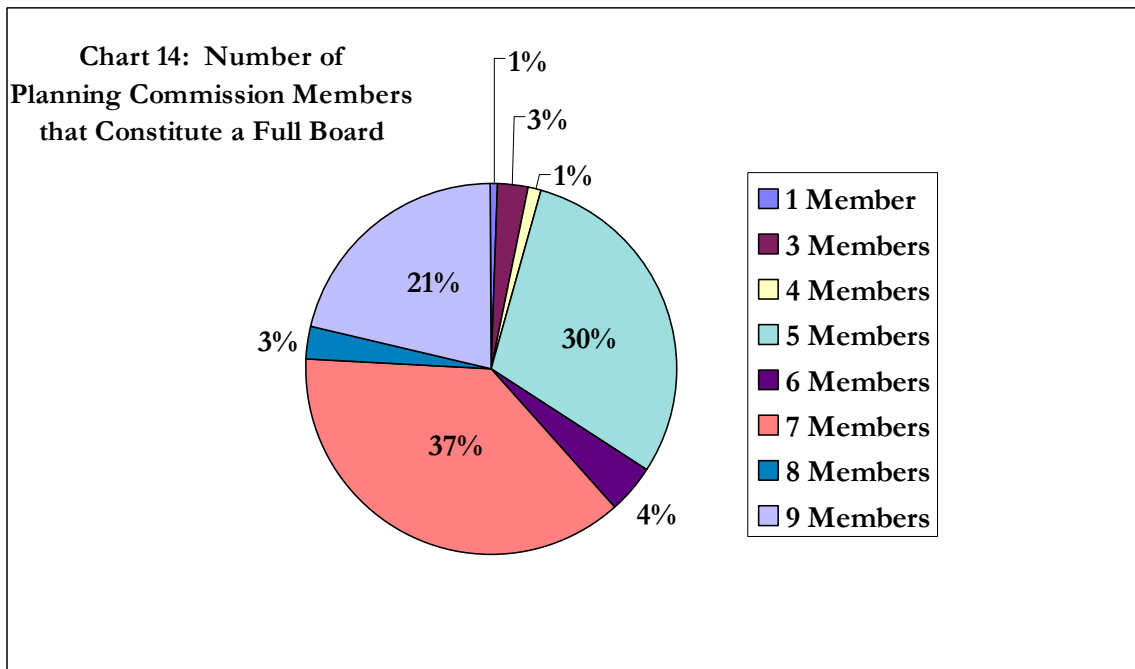


Number of Board / Committee Members

“How many members must a board / commission have?” Vermont law requires selectboards to have at least three members in each municipality. 17 V.S.A. § 2649. A municipality may vote at a special or annual town meeting to elect not more than two additional selectmen for terms of either one or two years each. 17 V.S.A. § 2650. Chart 13 indicates the breakdown of three and five-member boards. Bennington is the lone responding exception; their governance charter requires seven selectboard members.



A planning commission “shall have not less than three nor more than nine voting members.” 24 V.S.A. § 4322. This explains the wide range of planning commission sizes, as shown in Chart 14.



Like planning commissions, the development review board (DRB) and zoning board of adjustment (ZBA) for a municipality shall consist of not fewer than three nor more than nine persons, as determined by the legislative body of the municipality. 24 V.S.A. § 4460. Chart 15 and Chart 16 reflect the number of DRB and ZBA members that constitute a full board for responding municipalities.

Chart 15: Number of Development Review Board Members that Constitute a Full Board

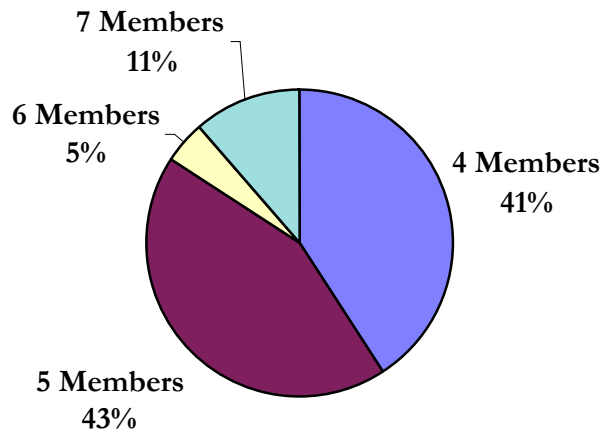
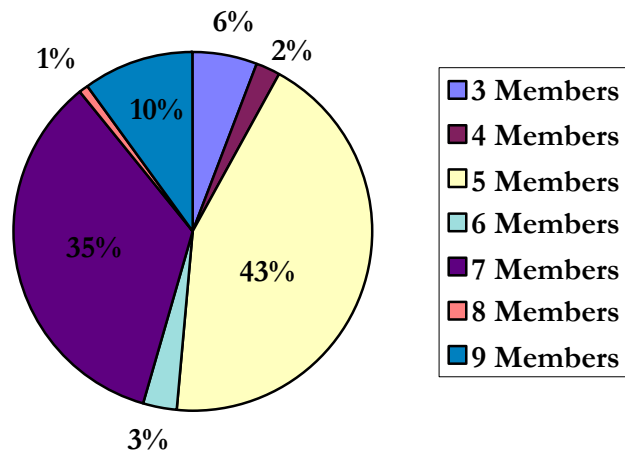
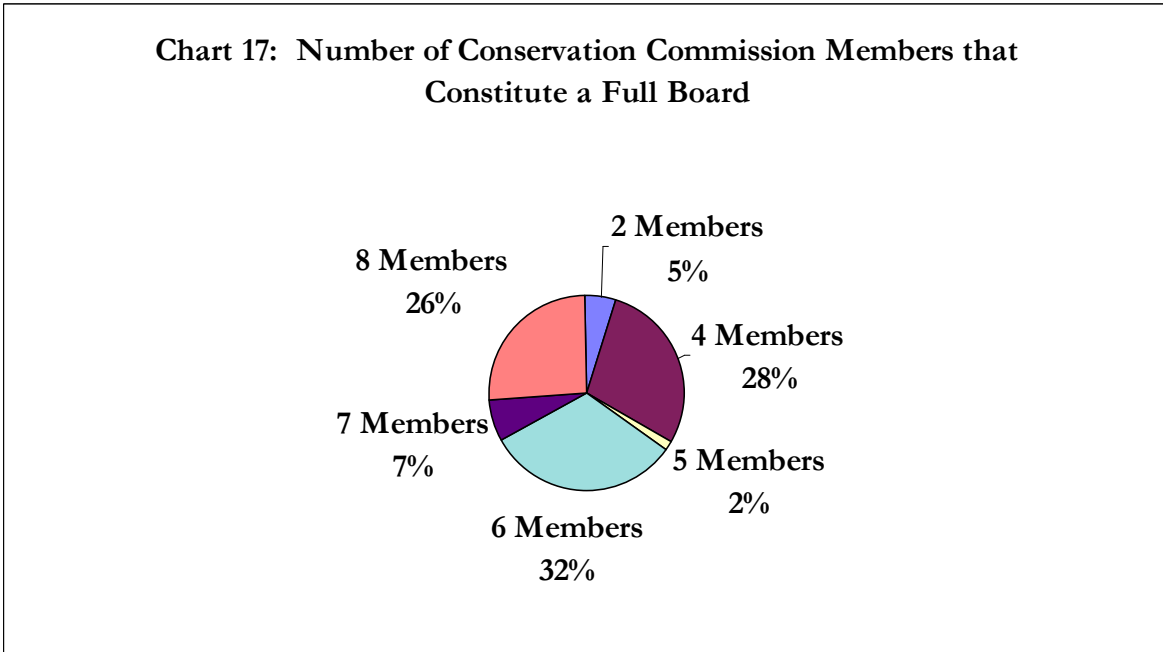


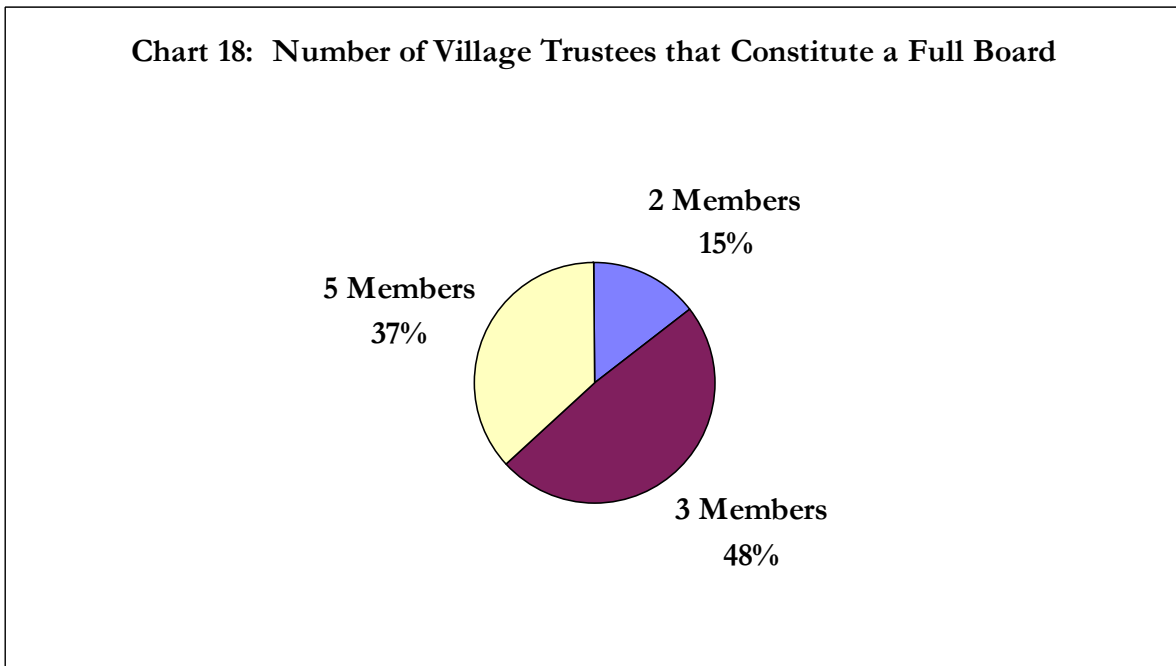
Chart 16: Number of Zoning Board of Adjustment Members that Constitute a Full Board



Like the previous board / commission types, a conservation commission shall also have not less than three nor more than nine members. 24 V.S.A. § 4502(a).

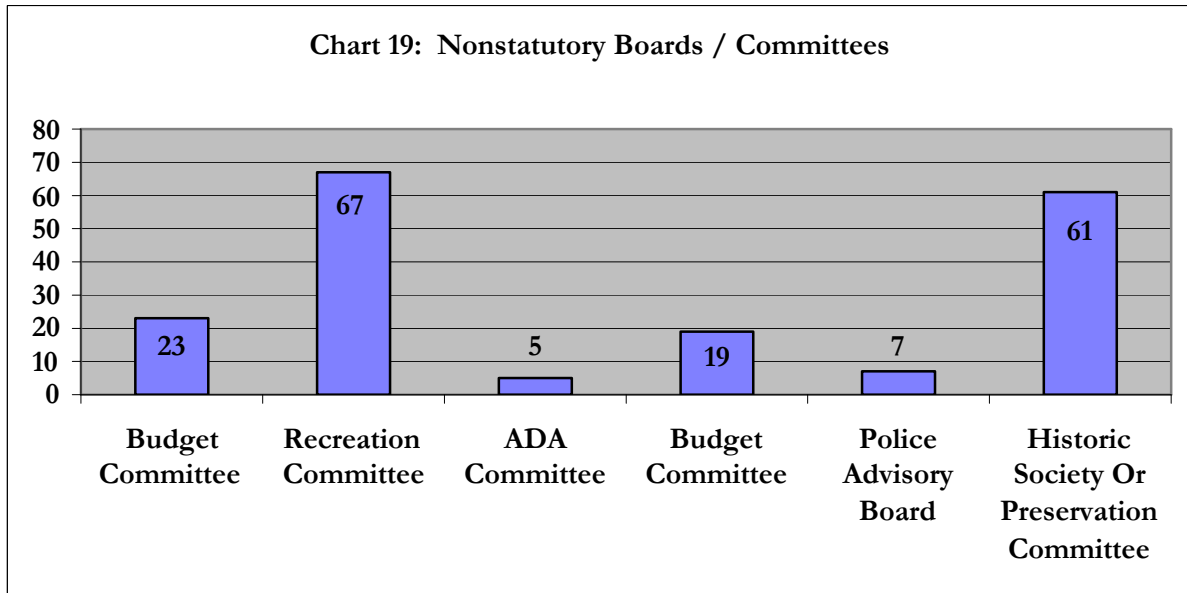


Twenty-four V.S.A. § 1304 states that an incorporated village should hold its first meeting and elect five trustees. Despite this language, Chart 18 indicates that a large percentage of responding municipalities declare that only 3 members constitute a full board in their village.



Non-Statutory Boards / Committees

Many municipalities find it beneficial to create additional boards and committees, not required by statute. Communities can create teams to forge effective solutions to potential problems, or to create better ways to serve their citizens. Chart 19 indicates a few non-statutory boards and committees that currently exist, and how many responding municipalities have these types of boards and committees.

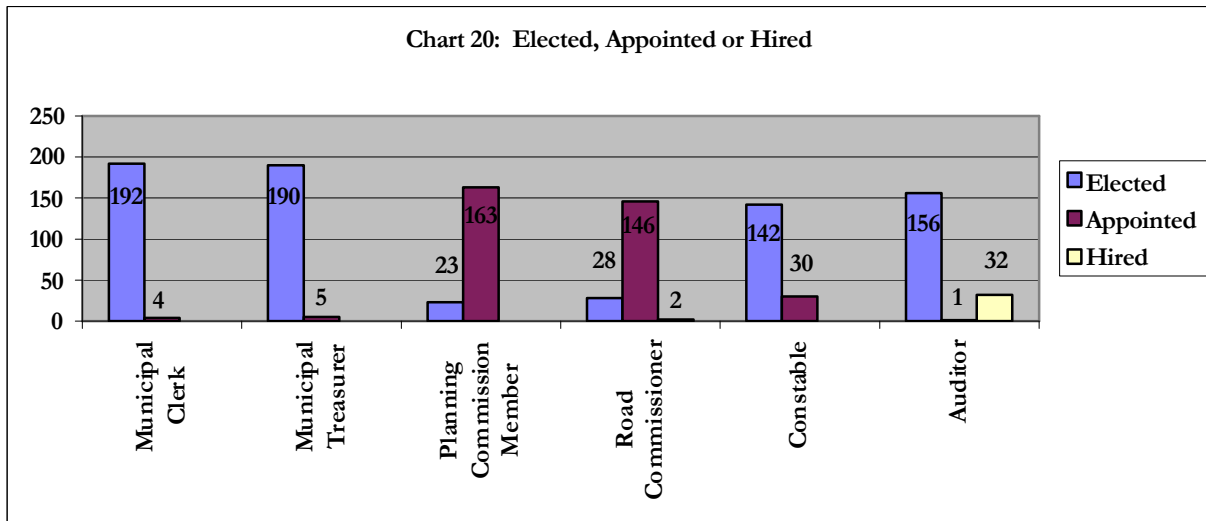


MUNICIPAL POSITIONS

Positions in local government are very diverse. VLCT’s Handbook for Vermont Town Officers provides an overview of duties and responsibilities of many of these positions. Most duties and functions are defined by state statute and case law. Municipal officers are appointed or elected, or sometimes hired; term lengths vary according to the position.

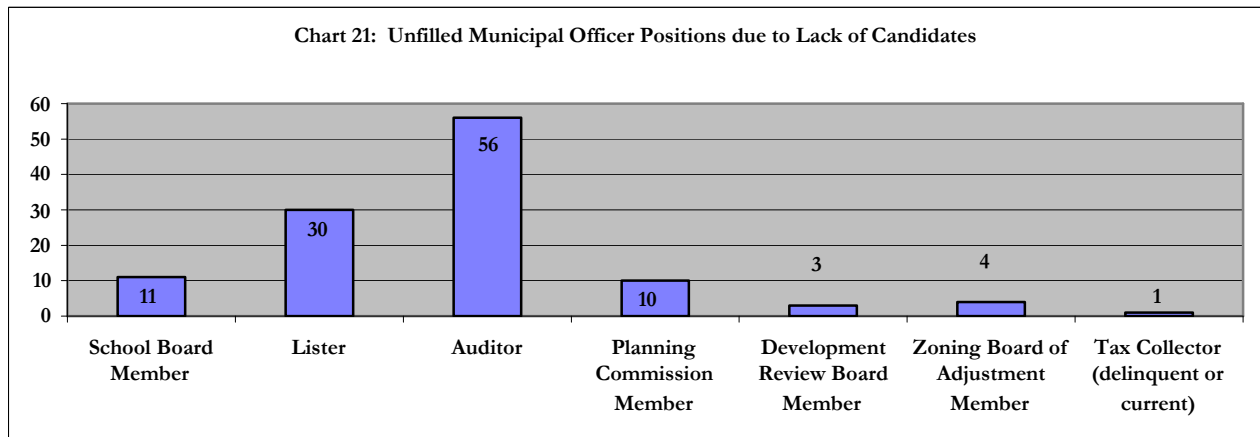
Elected, Appointed, or Hired

The Municipal Assistance Center receives frequent inquiries regarding how positions are acquired. Chart 20 indicates the number of positions that are acquired by election, appointment, or a hiring process.



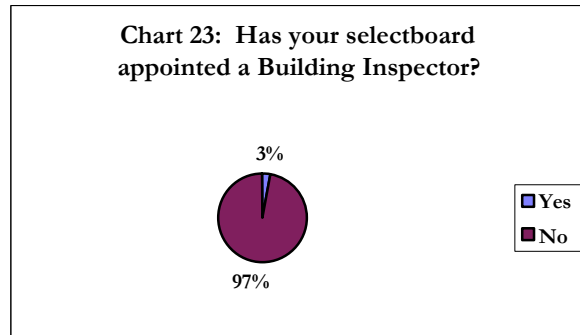
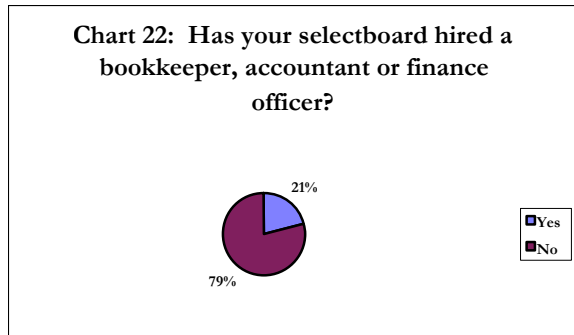
Unfilled Positions

Occasionally, petitions for municipal offices are not filed; in this case, no person is elected to the position. The legislative body may appoint a registered voter to fill the office until the next annual meeting. 17 V.S.A. § 2682(d). Chart 21 indicates some municipal offices that were not filled over the last three years due to lack of candidates.



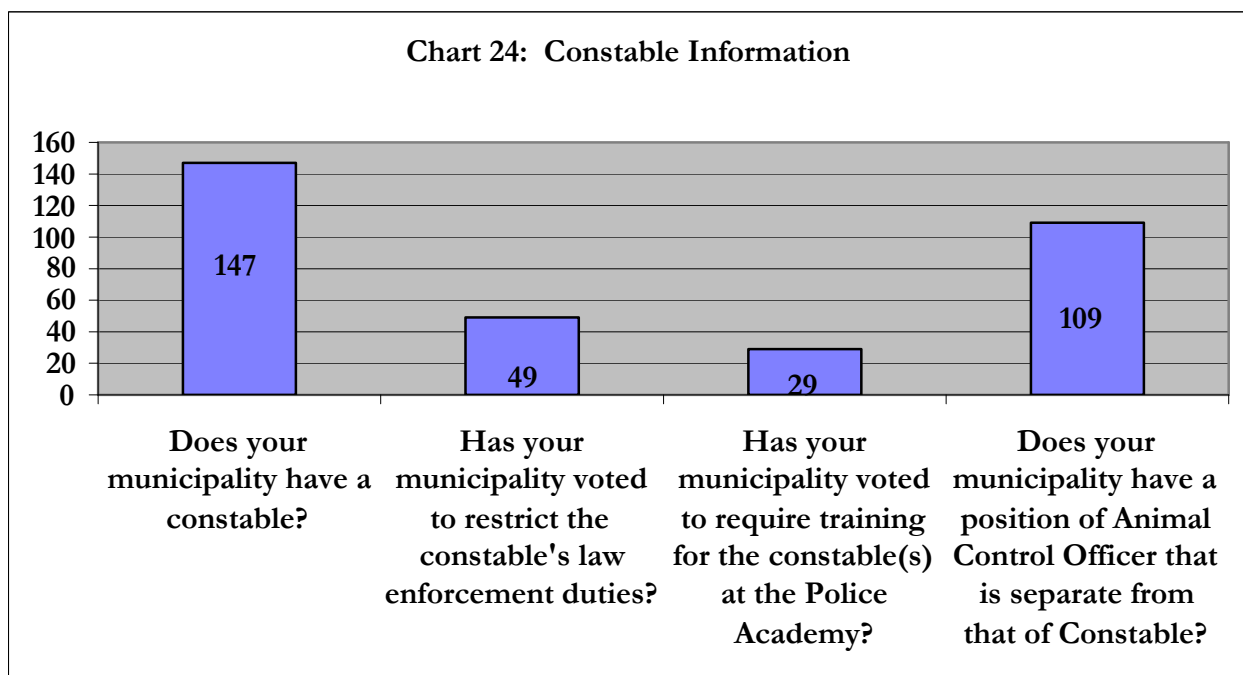
Financial Officer, Building Inspector

Chart 22 indicates that only 42 municipalities, or 21%, have hired some sort of financial officer. Chart 23 indicates that an even smaller percentage, 6 municipalities, or 3%, have appointed a building inspector.



Constable

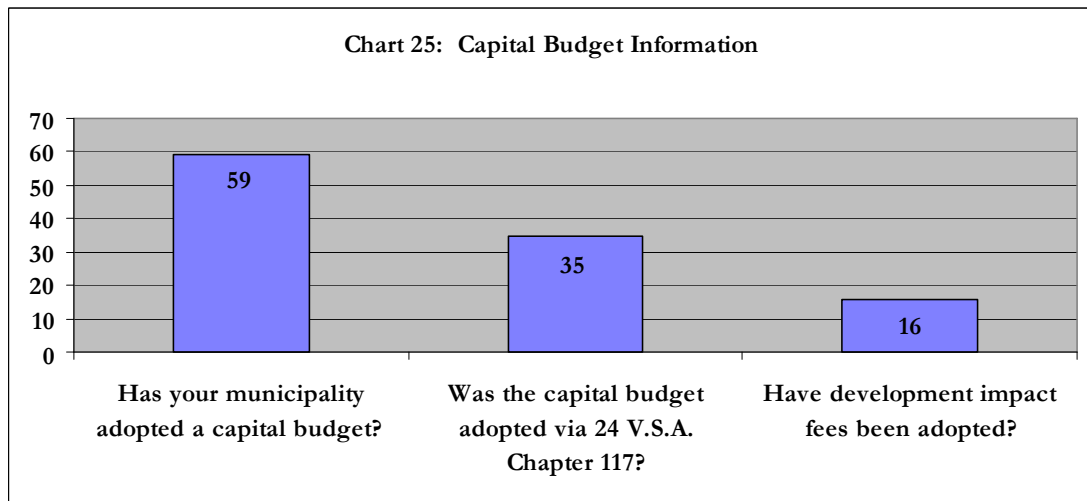
The constable is a law enforcement officer, as defined by Rule 54(c)(6) of the Vermont Rules of Criminal Procedure. As such, the constable has the authority to arrest and has search and seizure powers within the municipality. However, 24 V.S.A. § 1936a allows a municipality to vote, at a special or annual meeting, to prohibit constables from exercising any law enforcement authority. Chapter 151 of Title 20 also allows a municipality to vote to require a constable to successfully complete a training course. Chart 24 indicates that 147 responding municipalities, or 74%, have a constable. Only 33% of those municipalities with a constable restrict the law enforcement duties, and even fewer, 20%, require any specific training. Chart 24 also indicates that 75% of municipalities with constables have a separate employee who serves as the animal control officer.

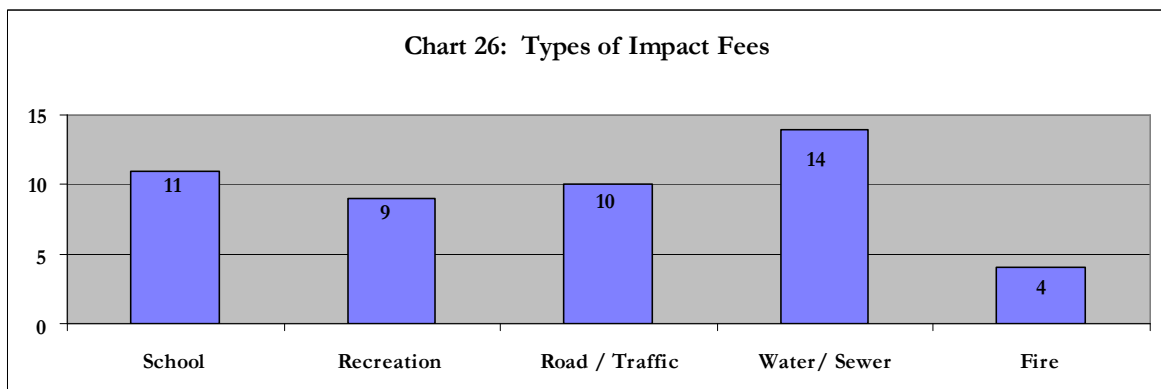
Capital Budget

A capital budget lists and describes capital projects that will be undertaken during a specified time period, the estimated costs of those projects, and the proposed method of financing. Many municipalities use a capital budget as an effective planning tool. Capital projects are defined in 24 V.S.A. § 4426. Chart 25 indicates that 59 responding municipalities, or 30%, have adopted some type of capital budget. Thirty-five municipalities have adopted their capital budget by the process laid out in 24 V.S.A. Chapter 117, and 16 municipalities have adopted impact fees to help pay for the projects laid out in the municipal capital budget.



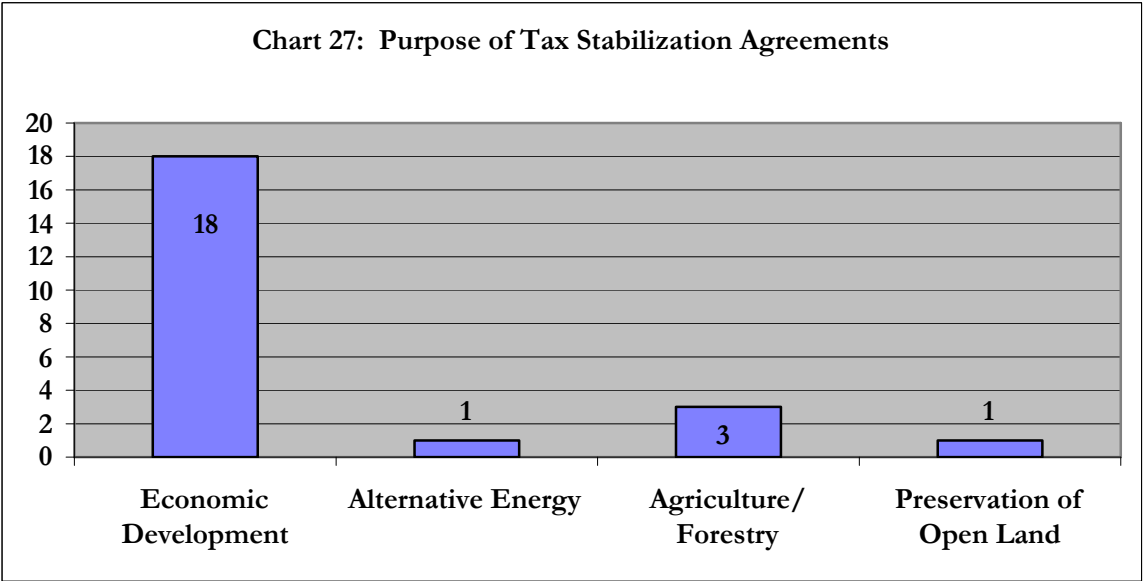
Impact Fees

Impact fees are levied as a condition of issuance of a land use permit and are intended to cover the additional cost of providing municipal services associated with a development project. Communities adopt various types of impact fee ordinances to meet their specific infrastructure needs. Chart 26 indicates the different types of impact fee ordinances that some responding municipalities have adopted. Water / Sewer impact fees are the most common, followed closely by school impact fees and road / traffic impact fees. Twenty-four V.S.A. Chapter 113 outlines the procedure required to levy impact fees. One procedural requirement is that a municipality must adopt a capital budget pursuant to 24 V.S.A. Chapter 117.



Tax Stabilization Agreements

According to 24 V.S.A. § 2741, municipalities “may enter into a contract with owners, lessees, bailees, or operators of agricultural, forest land, open space land, industrial or commercial real and personal property and alternate-energy generating plants” for the purpose of tax stabilization. Chart 27 indicates that few municipalities have created such contracts. Eighteen municipalities have tax stabilization agreements for economic development; 3 municipalities have agreements for agriculture / forestry; 1 municipality has an agreement with an alternative energy organization, and 1 municipality has an agreement with an organization for the preservation of open land.
