Grant writing requires understanding what funders want to see in projects as well as applications. ## Grant Basics: Developing and Funding the Project

Transforming an idea into a well-developed project plan is essential for winning grants because funders and voters want projects that are realistic, viable, and sustainable. Project development helps ensure you know what resources are needed to build, operate, maintain, and eventually replace a grant-funded project. It identifies red flags, builds a realistic timeline and budget, and aligns expectations among stakeholders.
