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Vermont's Health Insurers on COVID-19

Vermont health insurers **Blue Cross Blue Shield** and **MVP** both **began waiving the out of pocket expenses for COVID-19 testing** and, under certain circumstances, treatment, in April 2020.

On April 15, 2020, the Vermont Department of Financial Regulation announced [an emergency regulation requiring commercial insurers to waive cost-sharing requirements](#) [1], such as co-payments, coinsurance, or deductible requirements, for the diagnosis and treatment of COVID-19. **The emergency regulation is retroactive to March 13, 2020**, the date that Governor Scott declared a State of Emergency.
