 - Town vote
 - Temporary until July 1, 2024: switch annual meetings by legislative body vote (**if H.42 passes**)

BALLOTS TIMING



Made available at least 20 days before local election.

- Early and absentee voting allowed: <u>https://legislature.vermont.gov/s</u> <u>tatutes/chapter/17/051</u>.
- Selectboard can vote to mail ballots without request.

BALLOTS TIMING



Candidate petitions.

Candidate consent forms.

BALLOTS CONTENTS

- Produce yourselves if hand count; use vendor to produce if tabulators.
- Text must be black.
- Yes or no question format.
 - Model Town Meeting Articles.



BALLOTS CONTENTS

 Voter-Backed Petitions <u>FAQs</u>.
Model Social Service Appropriation <u>Policy</u>.





PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL HEARING

- Held within 10 days preceding the election.
- Temporary law (H.42): can be held entirely remotely (if it passes).

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PUBLIC INFORMATIONAL HEARING NOTICE

- Warned at least 10 days in advance
- Posting in at least two public places within municipality and in town clerk's office.
 - Model Australian Ballot Informational Hearing Notice
 - Remote Public Meetings Toolkit



- Open anytime between 5am and 10am
- Must remain open until 7pm
- Conducted like statewide elections
- Refer questions to <u>Secretary of</u> <u>State Elections</u> <u>Division</u>

STATUTORY DEADLINES

Voter-backed petitions due	Thursday, Jan. 19
First day to post warnings & notices	Thursday, Jan. 26
Candidate consent forms due by 5pm	Monday, Jan. 30
Last day to post warnings & notices	Sunday, Feb. 5
Ballots prepared and available	Wednesday, Feb. 15
Post warning for info hearing	Wed., Feb 15 – Fri., Feb. 24
First day to hold info hearing	Sat., Feb. 25



- Watch for updates on temporary law H.42. If it passes and the legislative body chooses to switch, the entire meeting moves to Australian ballot voting, not just one or two of the three categories. When the law expires, your method of voting reverts to "normal."
- Adoption of Australian ballot voting does not mean you automatically mail a ballot to voters; the selectboard must vote (more than 20 days before the election) to do so or a request is needed (which may be done in person, online, by phone, by email, or by mail).
