...so basically, removing the vulnerability.








Program (HMGP) (\$75+ million anticipated)

Flood Mitigation Assistance – Swift Current (\$40 million)

Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC)

Eligible Project Types:

- Property Buyouts
 - Properties at flood risk
 - Properties at risk from landslides
- Floodplain Restoration
- Culvert and Bridge Upsizing
- Road Relocation or Resilience Improvements
- Structural Elevations
- Local Hazard Mitigation Plan
 Development
- Other Planning and Scoping Activities



Property Buyouts:

- Voluntary for the property owner AND community
- Properties do not need to have past damage
- Eligible within the FEMA mapped Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) and the total project cost is under \$360,000 OR Substantial Damage in July
- Landslide buyouts with letter from State Geologist (imminent risk)
- Pre-event value appraisal or current market value
- State managed program
- State is covering the match for property buyouts

Property Elevations:

- Voluntary for the property owner AND community municipality as sub-applicant
- Properties do not need to have past damage
- Eligible within the FEMA mapped Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) and the total project cost is under \$228,000
- 25% non-federal match, in some cases, 90% or 100% federal funding is available
- Substantial Damage properties with flood insurance may be eligible for "increased cost of compliance" to be used towards match
- Flood insurance is required on the property in perpetuity

FEMA Funding Sources:

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)


- Funding based on July flooding event, anticipating \$75+ million
- Projects require a 25% local match
 - State funding is currently available to cover the match for buyout projects
- Deadline for Pre-Application Form is <u>June 21, 2024</u>, full applications due in late
- A Benefit-Cost Analysis (BCA) is required, except for most property buyouts and elevations
- Eligible applicants: municipalities, state agencies, other governing entities, specific non-profits if it relates to a critical facility
- Best use: implementation of projects (e.g., buyouts, culverts/bridges, floodplain restoration, dam removal)

FEMA Funding Sources:

• Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) Swift Current


- Funding based on July flooding event, \$40 million available
- Requires properties to have flood insurance through the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP)
- Some properties will be eligible for 90% of 100% federal share
- State deadline to FEMA is May 15, 2024
- Property buyout and elevation project will receive priority if you have contacted VEM by March 29, 2024
- Eligible applicants: municipalities, state agencies, other governing entities,
 specific non-profits if it relates to a critical facility
- Best use: implementation of individual property projects, including buyouts, elevations, and structural relocation




